Work Force Program



The Work Force crew started their employment with Gitlaxt'aamix Village Government (GVG) on April 29, 2016. They have been assigned to their work placement this week.

They are Basil Morgan, (Project Coordinator), Chantelle Elliott, (GVG Front Reception), Rebecca McMillan, (GVG Records Management), Lisa Munroe, (GVG Education Department), Janelle Robinson, Brandi Aksidan, (Homecare), Markus Bryant, Steven Adams, Jonathan Morven, (Brushing & Weeding), Richard Gonu, (Maintenance: Nass Valley Tours), Allen Gonu (GVG Carpentry) and Jenebi Morgan, (GVG Finance).

They also got to attend the 4 day NLG Special Assembly held in New Aiyansh recently. The Work Force crew have prepared a report outlining their impressions of the Special Assembly. What was good about the Special Assembly, what reports that caught their attention? The report will be from a young person's point of view and will be handed in to NLG President to address.

Basil is pushing the group towards a postsecondary education because the funding for education is available from GVG.

The big goal for the Work Force program is to get everybody with a driver's license because there are 5 of them who don't have a driver's license. Basil is going to get all the proper learning material so that they can get a learners license.

They will be required to take the NWCC courses in the Oil & Gas Certificate Program which awards them 6 safety tickets all bundled into one. The safety tickets are Occupational First Aid (OFA) Level 1, Transportation Endorsement, Transportation of Dangerous Goods, Workplace Hazardous Materials Information System (WHMIS), H2S Alive, Confined

The Work Force program is 8 months long and will end in December of this year.

Gitanyow has a similar assembly but it is smaller and not as in-depth as the NLG Special Assembly.

Payroll Compliance Practitioner (PCP) Award



Dena Robinson, Gitlaxt'aamiks Village Government (GVG) Human Resources Manager, recently received the PCP Certification Recognition Award in Vancouver for completing the prescribed courses in payroll. She has a dual role with the organization as she also processes payroll.

Dena's payroll career started in 1981 with New Aiyansh Village Government. She worked for one year as the payroll clerk. Payroll at the time was done manually. This meant manually calculating the hours of work and looking up the deductions for EI and CPP in a book. As status Indians working on reserve, taxes were not deducted. She does not recall the number of employees she had to process.

In 1982 her family moved to Alberta because the logging industry shut down. Her partner was out of work and had decided to relocate to find employment.

Dena decided to return to school because she knew that in order to get a better paying position she needed to get educated.

Dena took the first year of the Secretarial Science Program at Red Deer College in Red Deer, Alberta. After successfully completing this program she worked for Samson Band in the Maintenance Department as the Administrative Assistant in Hobbema, Alberta. She looked after the Apprenticeship program, making sure the employees obtained their hours required to advance to the next level of schooling. The program included carpenters, sheet metal, plumbing, electrical and water treatment.

In 1988 they decided to move home because they wanted to build a home. She obtained employment with Nisga'a Valley Health Authority (NVHA). While employed with NVHA she was enrolled with the two year Business Administration Program in 1993.

In 1995 Dena left NVHA to work with Gerald Robinson's company Wolf Pack Contracting as a bookkeeper.

In 2000 she was employed with Nisga'a Elections as the Administrative Assistant.

In 2001 she was employed with Nisga'a Lisims Government in various positions. While employed with NLG she transferred her Business Administration credits to the Canadian Payroll Association to obtain the Payroll Compliance Practitioner (PCP) Certification. Dena was required to complete a six month correspondence course and a 3 hour test to obtain certification. To maintain certification she had to take training programs to keep in compliance with legislation and if she did not do the training she would lose her certification.

GVG recognizes the need to continue moving forward and keeping in compliance with legislation and continues to support staff like her to maintain certification in her chosen career path.

PCP certification is the beginning level she can move onto Certified Payroll Manager certification. Certified payroll clerks earn up to \$10,000 to \$15,000 more in annual salary than uncertified payroll clerks.

More organizations are seeking out the certified payroll clerks.

Dena received the invitation to attend the Payroll Compliance Practitioner (PCP) Certification Recognition Award this year after she completed her training hours. She had always refused previously and was encouraged to attend this year.

Dena is so grateful that she went because it reminded her of what she has done and why she does what she does. She prides herself with her processes.

GVG Finance just completed this year's audit and she received a compliment from the auditor. This is her report card of a job well done.

Dena is short two courses for her Business Administration diploma, Cost Accounting 1 & 2.

She is near the completion of her Public Administration certification. The recognition award gives her motivation to work on obtaining the diploma for Business Administration.

Dena is grateful her late parents encouraged her to get educated and to get the better paying positions so that they can be independent.
